Warehousing

Regulations

Casualty Litigation/Product Liability

Personal injury actions arising out of vehicle collisions or improperly loaded freight often have product liability elements. Benesch has provided counsel not only in transportation matters but also in the product liability aspects of vehicular engine, tractor, trailer and tanker component parts. These issues come into play in freight loss and damage situations and also in situations alleging personal injury to employees of shippers, carriers, consignees and third parties.

Freight Loss and Damage

Benesch has assisted the industry in all aspects of freight loss, damage and delay litigation. We have handled multimodal freight damage, loss and delay claims, which combine various liability limitation regimes, including the Carmack Amendment, the Carriage of Goods by Sea Act, the Pomerene Act and the Warsaw Convention/Montreal Protocol.

Benesch has experience in the various liability regimes that relate to all types of freight intermediaries, including surface, air and ocean freight forwarders, transportation brokers, shippers' agents, logistics managers, 3PLs, 4PLs, reverse logistics managers, NVOCCs, and shippers' consortiums. We have also dealt with issues that arise from the juxtaposition of these intermediaries and their respective liability regimes in situations involving freight loss and damage, personal injury, and freight charge issues.

When the product reaches the docks or the consignee's location, Benesch has specific and extensive experience in litigating disputes relating to unloading liability in freight loss and damage and personal injury situations. Benesch also has experience in dealing with freight loss and damage and delay claims in all modes, sealed container issues, and shipper's load and count issues.
