Not-for-Profit Spotlight



When her parents fell upon hard times, Lily Smith was referred to the Transitional Respite Program at New Avenues to Independence by the Cuyahoga County Board of Developmental Disabilities. Lily's family was homeless and living out of their car. Fortunately, New Avenues' Respite Program took Lily off the streets and placed her in a safe, home environment. Thanks to its contributors, New Avenues provided Lily with clothing, toiletries, bedding and special touches including a radio and TV. When Lily

arrived at New Avenues, she was quiet and reserved. Within a week, she was comfortable laughing and talking. Lily now attends New Avenues' Vocational Services Program, Buckeye Industries*, learning janitorial skills. Recently, because of an opening in the organization's Overlook group home, Lily moved into a permanent living arrangement and has her own room.

Lily is just one example of the many individuals whose lives have been positively changed by New Avenues. A group of dedicated parents founded New Avenues as the Parents Volunteer Association (PVA) in 1952 to provide educational, vocational and recreational experiences for children with disabilities. As the children grew and their needs changed, the founders incorporated PVA in 1956 and pursued community integration through group home settings. Thus, in 1971, PVA became owner and operator of the first private, non-profit group home for individuals with disabilities in Cuyahoga County, Ohio. In the subsequent five decades, the agency continued to grow, purchasing eight additional homes and expanding services throughout Northeast Ohio. In 2000, PVA changed its name to New Avenues to Independence, Inc., to reflect the expanding array of services provided and the changing demographics of the individuals served.

New Avenues' mission is to provide opportunities for people with disabilities and special needs to become more independent and productive members of society by offering the highest quality support services and developing innovative and inclusive programs. New Avenues achieves its mission by offering residential, community-based, vocational, transitional respite, housing and children's programs.

New Avenues programs currently serve more than 600 individuals aged three to 100 years in Northeast Ohio, including those with developmental disabilities, mental illness, autism, cerebral palsy, brain injury and Down syndrome. New Avenues has a Clinical Services Department comprising a nursing staff charged with overseeing the health of individuals receiving services from New Avenues. In addition, New Avenues offers physical, occupational, speech, art, music and recreational therapies.

Over the past two decades, the New Avenues Benesch Team has assisted New Avenues with government affairs, bond issuance, financing and 501(c)(3) and (c)(2) status, in addition to participating on its Board of Directors as members and officers.
