"No one really enjoys fund-raising, but Ira understands that philanthropy plays an important role in giving Cleveland's marginalized and low-income populations a chance to live healthy and successful lives," Mitchell Balk said.

"Ira represents a true beacon of leadership at Benesch and beyond," said Managing Partner Gregg Eisenberg. "His unwavering commitment to the public good, uplifting the city and supporting diverse causes reflects his true spirit of excellence, and this recognition is well-deserved."

Ira is the firm's executive chairman and a former managing partner, and he serves as a member of the firm's executive committee.
